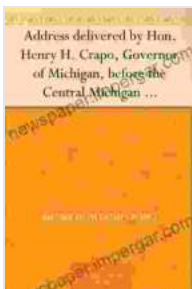


Address Delivered by Hon. Henry Crapo, Governor of Michigan, Before the Central Republican Club of New York City, Tuesday, February 28, 1888

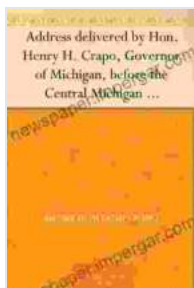

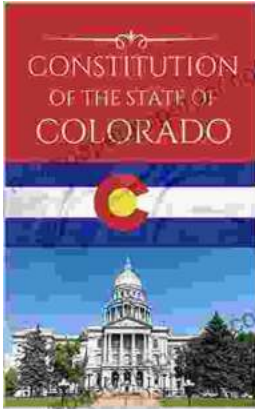
