and the Challenge of Islamic Feminism** . Barlas is a professor of politics at Ithaca College, and she lives in Ithaca, New York.

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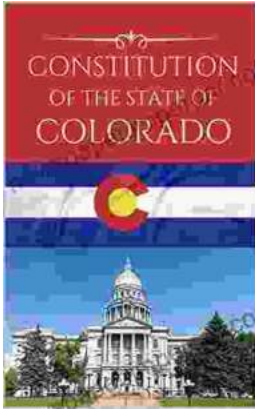


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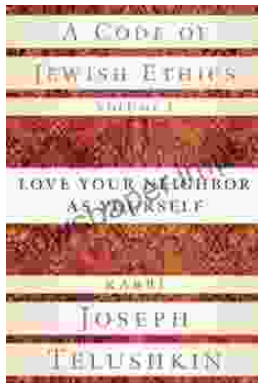
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
