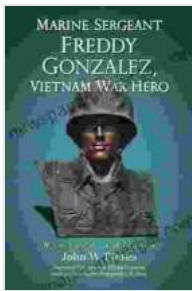


# Marine Sergeant Freddy Gonzalez: A Vietnam War Hero

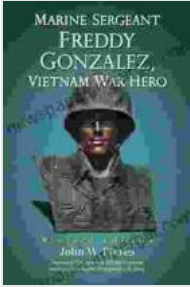

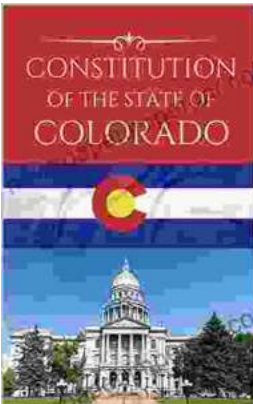
