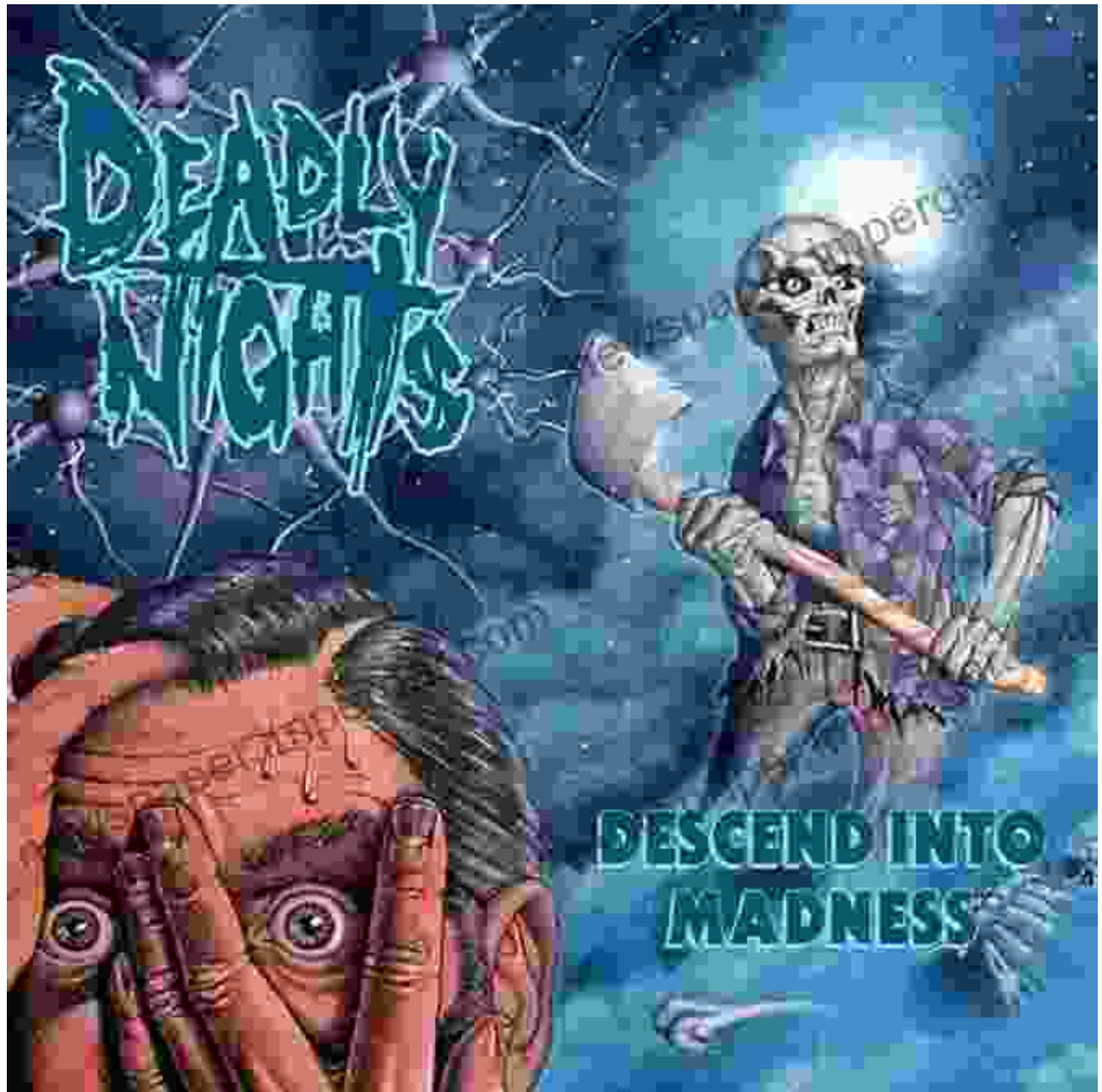

Madness Afoot



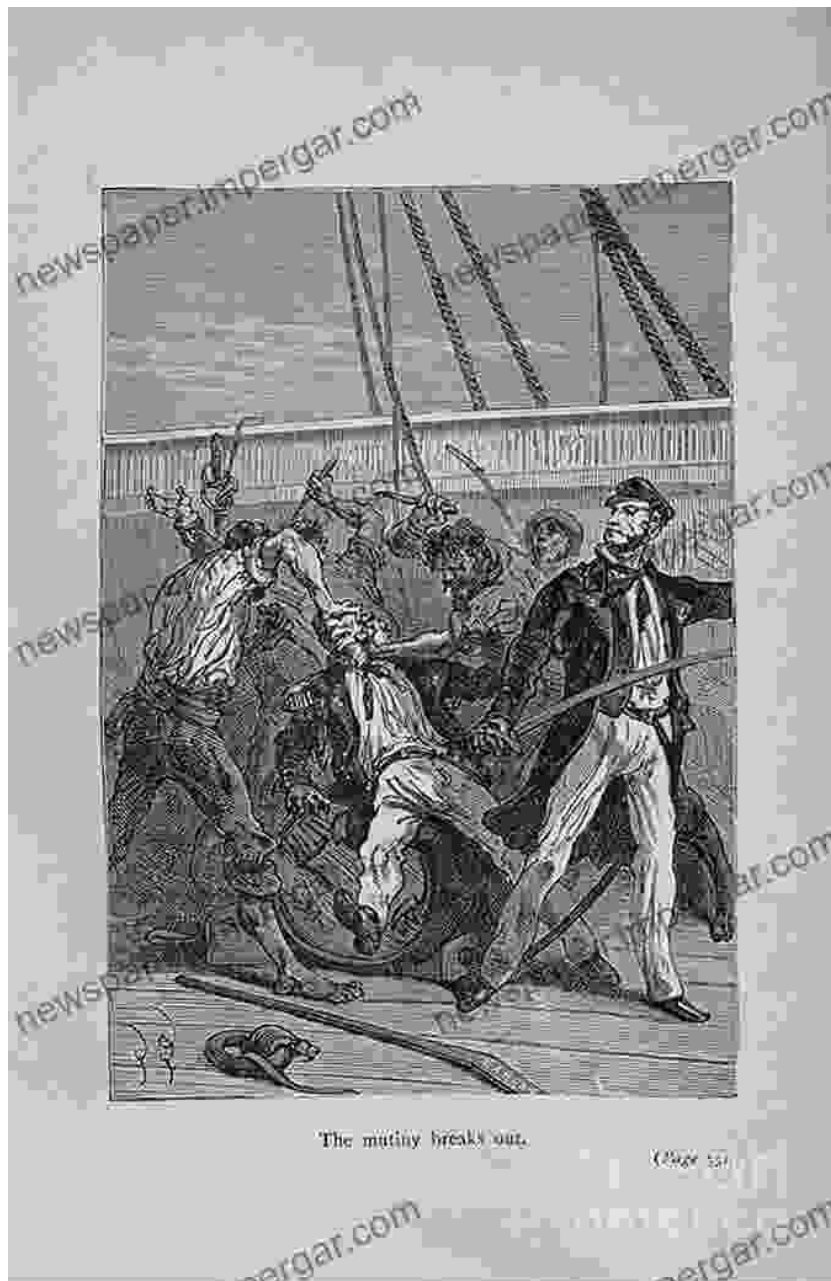

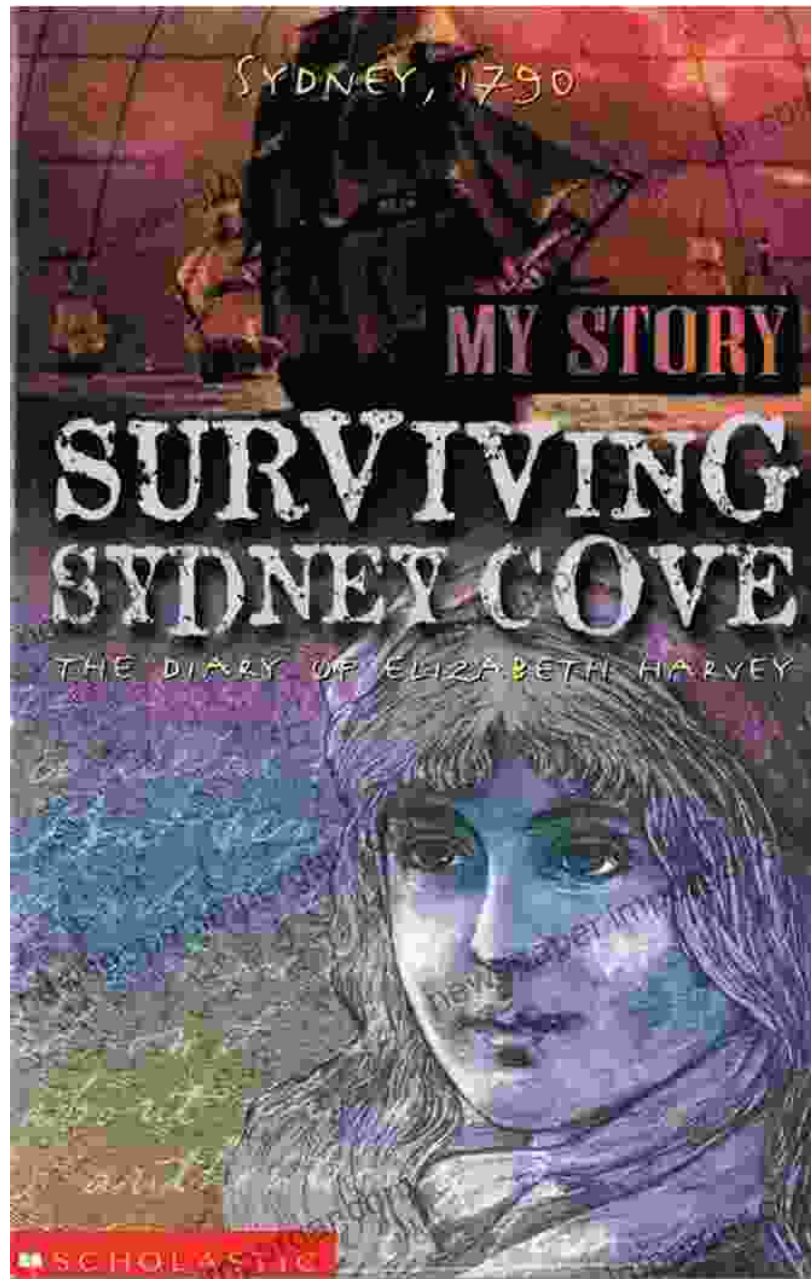

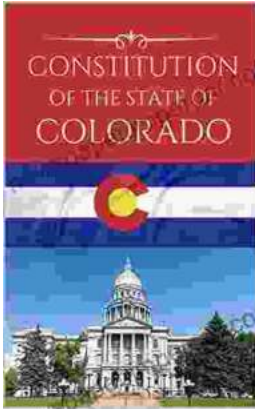
